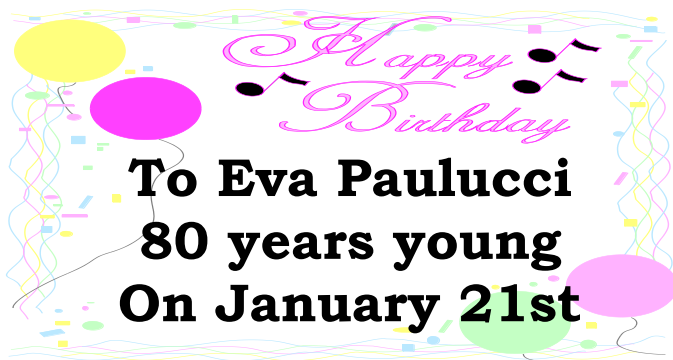

1. (b) Peter baptized the people in the household of Cornelius even though they were Gentiles who didn't keep kosher or circumcise their male children (Acts 10). Early Christians saw this as a sign that the gospel was meant for everyone. It also showed the children perhaps even infants, were baptized in the earliest years of the Church (CCC, n. 1252)
2. (d) Christian Initiation is accomplished by Baptism, which is the beginning of new life; Confirmation, which strengthens this new life; Eucharist, which nourishes disciples with Christ's body and blood fro their transformation in Christ (CCC, n. 1275)

Children: What do you think it was like for the people in today's Gospel to be called by Jesus? What did they have to give up in order to follow him?

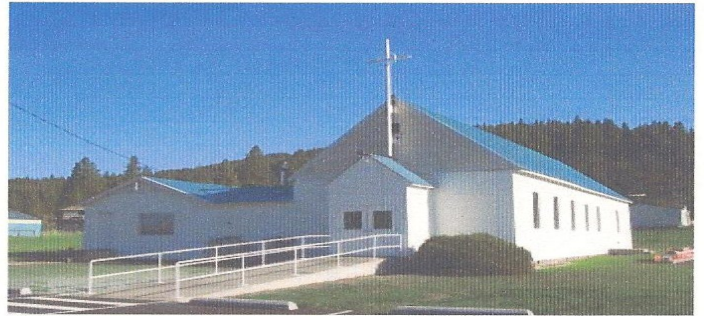


Why give to the Black and Indian Missions/ Home Missions Collection on January 28-29th?
