Conversation for the ride home:

The Gospel: Mark 1:21-28 *“What is this? A new teaching with authority.”*

Adults: Name one of the most persistent “demons” who seeks authority in your life. Is there a higher authority that can make this negative influence hit the road?

Reflection: In this reading Jesus teaches and acts with authority. In this first miracle recorded by Mark, Jesus shows his power over the forces of evil. Even the evil spirit gives witness to Jesus, recognizing him as “the Holy One of God” and submitting to his commands.

We should learn to trust in Jesus and his loving care for us. We should listen each day for his quiet voice in our hearts, urging us to trust him and to do what he asks.

FATHER'S CORNER

On January 23, 2012, we remembered the anniversary of the legalization of abortion in the famous Rhode vs. Wade Supreme Court ruling in 1973. Since then more than 50 million babies have been destroyed through abortion. The age of women having abortions goes from 13-45 years of age. The Church states that "Procured abortion is the deliberate and direct killing, by whatever means it is carried out, of a human being in the initial phase of his or her existence, extending from conception to birth." Today, in many people's consciences, the perception of its gravity has become progressively obscured. The acceptance of abortion in the popular mind, in behavior and even in law itself, is a telling sign of an extremely dangerous crisis of the moral sense, which is becoming more and more incapable of distinguishing between good and evil, even when the fundamental right to life is at stake. In this regard the reproach of the Prophet is extremely straightforward: "Woe to those who call evil good and good evil, who put darkness for light and light for darkness" (Is 5:20).

The moral gravity of procured abortion is apparent in all its truth if we recognize that the one eliminated is a human being at the very beginning of life. No one more absolutely innocent could be imagined. In no way could this human being ever be considered an aggressor, much less an unjust aggressor! He or she is weak, defenseless, even to the point of lacking that minimal form of defense consisting in the poignant power of a newborn baby's cries and tears. The unborn child is totally entrusted to the protection and care of the woman carrying him or her in the womb. And yet sometimes it is precisely the mother herself who makes the decision and asks for the child to be eliminated, and who then goes about having it done.

It is true that the decision to have an abortion is often tragic and painful for the mother, insofar as the decision to rid herself of the fruit of conception is not made for purely selfish reasons or out of convenience, but out of a desire to protect certain important values such as her own health or a decent standard of living for the other members of the family. Sometimes it is feared that the child to be born would live in such conditions that it would be better if the birth did not take place. Nevertheless, these reasons and others like them, however serious and tragic, can never justify the deliberate killing of an innocent human being.

All other rights are secondary to the fundamental right to life. Without life it does not make sense to speak of rights. Jesus came to lead us out of darkness and the power of evil into his own wonderful light. He cares for and loves each woman and each child threaten by abortion. His mercy is everlasting.

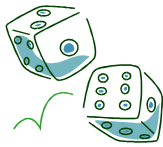
