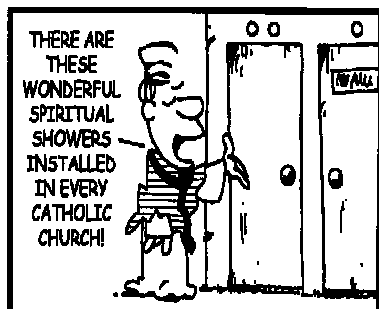
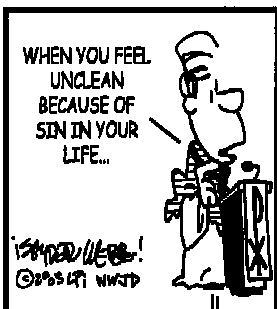

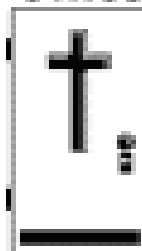

Roman Catholic Diocese of Boise Capital Campaign Preliminary Case Statement

The Roman Catholic Diocese of Boise is a growing and vibrant Catholic faith community that encompasses the entire state of Idaho, an area of over 83,000 square miles. Led by Bishop Michael P. Driscoll, the Diocese has nearly 200,000 Catholics, worshipping in 51 parishes and 37 missions. Compelled by the Gospel message to make disciples, preach the Good news, and serve the least among us, the faithful of the Diocese are being invited to join our Bishop in generating the financial means needed to further our mission and secure a solid financial foundation for our future.

In 2008 the pastoral plan for the Church of Idaho, *“All at the Table”*, was finalized after much discussion and input from parishioners and parish leadership. The goal of our pastoral plan was to become a Church of Idaho *“where all are invited to use their unique gifts and particular roles to grow in persona. Holiness, to transform our parishes communities and to renew our world.”*

While we recognize, honor, and celebrate the considerable pastoral, sacramental, catechetical, and charitable works that have been and are being performed throughout the Diocese, we also recognize that there are continuing challenges and opportunities as we travel together on our journey of discipleship as faithful stewards. Continuing our efforts to fulfill the objectives of our pastoral plan, Bishop Driscoll is inviting the faithful to consider the following priorities as preparations are made for a possible diocesan-wide capital campaign. This campaign will attempt to generate \$15,000,000 to strengthen the Catholic Church throughout Idaho.

Care of Our Retired Priests

Those men who are ordained to the priesthood spend years in service to the faithful. They pastor our parishes, baptize our children, anoint our sick and minister the sacraments to our families. They have dedicated their lives to guiding us in our care and attention. From time to time, in addition to the priests' retirement program, special funding is required as our priests age to meet extraordinary expenses such as specialized nursing care. At other times, they may have medical costs beyond their means. This campaign is our opportunity to give back to them for all the ways they have given us.

Our goal will be to establish an Infirm Priests Fund to assist with the medical costs of our aged and retired priests during severe illnesses. With an aging priesthood in our Diocese, the potential for more priests becoming dependent on this fund increases each year. An infusion of \$1,500,000 to this fund from our campaign will provide assistance to those priests in need for the foreseeable future.

Educating our Seminarians, Priests and Permanent Deacons

The Diocese of Boise is committed to providing for the pastoral and sacramental needs of parish communities by seeking, encouraging, and supporting men interested in serving the Church as priests or permanent deacons. Currently, we have nine men studying for the priesthood who hope to be ordained in the future. At a cost of \$35,000 per seminarian annually, the Idaho Catholic Appeal, the Catholic Extension Society, and the current Seminarian Burse provide much of the cost of seminarian formation. However, the number of current seminarians makes it difficult to fund this vital ministry which ultimately benefits all the faithful. In our campaign, a \$1,500,000 endowment fund will be established to provide for education of seminarians, promote vocations, and fund the continuing education of all clergy serving the Church of Idaho.

Catholic Education in our Schools, Parishes, and Colleges

The Diocese of Boise is committed to providing the highest quality education, faith formation, and life long learning opportunities through our parishes, our fourteen Catholic schools, and our three college campus ministry centers. Our plan calls for an education endowment of \$2,000,000 for tuition assistance as well as grants to support educational and formational programs for schools and parish religious education programs for children, youth, and adults.

An additional \$1,000,000 will be dedicated to providing funding to programs, building improvements and upgrades to our three Catholic Campus Ministry centers at Boise State University in Boise, Idaho State University in Pocatello, and the University of Idaho in Moscow.

Serving those in Need - Catholic Charities of Idaho

While only ten years old, Catholic Charities of Idaho has provided life-giving services to over 6,00 men, women, and children throughout our diocese in the past year alone. The mission of CCI is clear - to provide help, create hope, and promote justice in order to strengthen families and local communities. Already present in four deaneries throughout our state, CCI wants to expand to serve more communities and more people as funds become available. By creating an endowment of \$4,000,000 this campaign will serve as a springboard to help CCI expand counseling and education services, economic stability programs and immigration assistance throughout the diocese. The endowment will also strengthen individuals and communities through direct social services, parish outreach, leadership training and advocacy programs.

Idaho Catholic Appeal

The annual Idaho Catholic Appeal generates \$2,500,00 for the operations and sustainability of existing Diocesan ministries and programs. The ministries that are supported by the ICA touch the lives of thousands of people throughout Idaho. These funds, raised by our parishes, demonstrate the generous support of our parishioners for the mission of the larger Church. Maintaining the financial resources required to sustain these ministries, programs, services, and central administrative and pastoral offices is vital. Since we may be embarking on a diocesan capital campaign in 2012, a decision must be made as to whether or not to incorporate the 2013 Idaho Catholic Appeal into this campaign, with the return of the ICA in 2014.

Strengthening Parishes

Though the Catholic Church is truly universal, we most often experience Church in our local parish,. It is at the local parish level that the healing, teaching, reconciling, and sanctifying mission of Christ becomes most evident. Each parish depends on the Diocese and yet the Diocese exists through its parishes. The continued growth of Catholics in our diocese is a true sign of our vibrancy as the Church of Idaho. However, such growth continues to present extra challenges on our parish communities as they strive to meet the needs of an increasing Catholic population. Raising funds is crucial for the majority of parishes if they are to fulfill the Church's mission now and in the years ahead.

Every parish faces its own challenges and goals. Some parishes may require building, restoration, maintenance, repair, or renovation. Other parishes are looking to reduce debt, while some are striving to establish endowments that will generate income for parish and school ministries and services. Still others may need personnel or materials to carry forth the teachings of Christ and the mission of the Church.

A financial return for each parish will be incorporated into our campaign. Every parish will have a financial target based on their offertory income and as funds are raised, a percentage of funds raised will remain in the parish. In this way, both the Diocese and each individual parish will benefit from a successful campaign.

If we move forward with a campaign, steps will be taken to ensure that the Catholic presence remains viable in our Diocese for years to come. We know that our greatest strength is the faith of our people, and this campaign is centered primarily on people and their spiritual growth and development. We are relying on our input, thoughts and suggestions in developing this case statement as we work together as the Church of Idaho.
