# FATHER'S CORNER

Job said, "I have been assigned months of misery, and trouble nights have been allotted to me. I am filled with restlessness until the dawn."

Job was a wealthy man who was blest with a beautiful family. He lost everything in an instant. In addition, he experienced great desolation, illness and suffering without any fault on his part. In Job's time, it was believed that one's sufferings were the direct result of one's sins. In his desolation, he tries to understand why God has allowed this to happen to him. Today, many people like Job, experience desolation, illness, suffering and death.

Suffering is a personal experience. It is something that directly hurts the person. Suffering constitutes the significant, subjective dimension of pain, a pain understood either in a physical-medical sense as well as in a spiritual moral sense». The person experiences suffering in his or her body-soul unified totality. It affects him or her physically, psychologically, emotionally and spiritually. Therefore, «people can be said to experience suffering when they perceived themselves as threatened with either loss of control or disintegration of their very person». The most common response to suffering in our contemporary society is to eliminate it at all costs. At times, this includes the elimination of the person who is suffering.

During his public ministry, Jesus encountered many people who were suffering physically and spiritually. He cured many who were sick with various diseases. Yet, he did not eliminate suffering altogether. Instead, he embraced it and gave it a redemptive power and meaning. The problem we have today is our inability to find or give meaning to human suffering. The words from famed psychiatrist Viktor Frankl are profoundly helpful. He states that the human person has a «uniquely human potential, to find, and fulfill meaning even in *extremis* and *in ultimus*—in an extreme life situation such as Auschwitz and even in the

face of one's death in a gas chamber». This potential comes from man's self-transcendence, namely, by being "always directed, and pointing, to something or someone other than oneself: to a meaning to fulfill or another human being to encounter, a cause to serve or a person to love."

According to Frankl, the reason modern society struggles to give or find meaning in suffering derives from the fact that it has become used to see and value man as the «*homo sapiens*, the clever man» and disregards man as the «*homo patiens*, the suffering man». The *homo sapiens* is the man «who knows how to be a success, how to be a successful businessman or a successful play boy, that is, how to be successful in making money and in making love». The *homo patiens*, by contrast, is «the man who knows how to suffer, how to mold even his sufferings into a human achievement».

During our earthly pilgrimage, we will experience suffering. The good news is that we are not alone or abandoned in our suffering. Jesus, our Lord and Savior, has taken upon himself every human suffering and in Him we experience healing and wholeness. By his wounds we are healed.

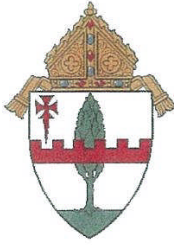

3. (d) Catechumens received into full communion at the Easter Vigil celebrate all the Sacraments of Initiation—Baptism, Confirmation, and the First Eucharist—during the same liturgy.

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On January 20<sup>th</sup>, the United States Department of Health and Human Services issued a rule mandating that contraceptives, abortion-inducing drugs, and sterilization be included at no cost to the insured in all health care plans. This means that health insurers will be forced to include these immoral “services” in their health plans and that every employer, *including Catholic parishes, schools, hospitals, charitable organizations, and social service agencies*, will be forced to provide and pay for this coverage that is a clear violation of Catholic teaching.

This decision by the Department of Health and Human Services rejected the strong appeals made by hundreds of religious institutions and hundreds of thousands of concerned citizens who had vigorously argued against the mandate and encouraged a broader exemption that would include religious institutions and ministries. This decision poses a real threat to Catholic Church’s capacity to offer adequate health care coverage for those who work in our parishes, schools, and various institutions.

As your Bishop, I urge you to speak out for the protection of conscience rights and religious liberty that are essential to the common good of our nation. I also urge you to contact your legislators and ask them to do all that is possible to reverse this unconscionable mandate.

As Americans and as Catholics, we are blessed with religious liberty which safeguards our right to live our principles and moral convictions. Our civil laws should fully recognize and protect our right, obligation, and opportunities to participate in society without being forced to abandon or ignore the central moral convictions of our Catholic faith. Please join me in making your voice known as together we join other people of faith in rescinding this unjust Health and Human Services mandate!
